We ask all participants, especially the chair persons, to read carefully the following information.

Information for Chair Persons

- Please introduce the speaker with a few words.
- At the beginning of the session and of the subsequent lectures make sure that the

audience is seated and ready as quickly as possible so that the lecture can begin on time.

- The time limit of a single lecture is 20 min, followed by 10 min of discussion. The time limit of 30 minutes in total has to be respected. Please remind the speaker after 20 minutes that he or she should bring his or her talk to an end; do not let the speaker talk for more than 25 minutes.
- If the lecture and discussion lasts less than 30 minutes, wait until the time indicated in the programme before introducing the next speaker. Please do not start earlier.
- If a paper is cancelled, please announce a break of 30 minutes. Do not switch to the next paper.
- You are responsible for managing the discussion following the talk. In case nobody dares to ask the first question, please have at least one question prepared.

Information for Speakers

- Lectures should not last longer than 20 minutes, followed by 10 minutes discussion.
- Please have your presentation ready on a USB-stick in powerpoint or pdf format and deliver the stick well ahead of the time of your talk (at the very latest at the beginning of the break before your talk) to the responsible person in your lecture room.
- -You can check your presentation in the Speakers' Office (A 120) beforehand. You will also be able to print your paper there.

Information for Poster Presentations

- Please exhibit your poster as soon as you have registered. Pin boards will be available.
- The Poster Sessions are scheduled for Friday, 1-2 pm and 6-7 pm. Please be near your poster during this time.
- Poster presenters are welcome to put up their posters from Tuesday 9 am onwards.
- A poster evaluation committee will choose the best poster and announce the winner and present the prize during the reception on Friday evening (among others a 100,- €book voucher by BAR Publishing).
